



What to pack

Dressing in several layers is important because the weather changes from cool to warm and sunny. Layers allow you to be comfortable with minimal inconvenience. The boats we fish out of are open sleds. Morning boat travel can be cold so prepare by bringing layers of warm clothing with a waterproof outer layer. Because Alaska weather can be unpredictable it is good to have your raingear handy. You'll no doubt be bringing home a *lot* of fish, so pack light

We recommend that you pack the following items:

- Clothing for relaxing
- Comfortable shoes for use on land
- Warm layers for boat travel; short- and long-sleeve shirts, jeans or other casual pants, fleece pullover or wool sweater
- Good selection of socks
- Quality rain gear
- Breathable chest waders and boots
- Gloves
- Warm hat
- Polarized sunglasses
- Sunscreen
- Bug repellent – min 30% Deet
- Binoculars
- Camera (charger, batteries, memory card etc)
- Toiletries
- Medications
- Cash (gratuities)
- Fishing license
- King Salmon Stamp, seasonal
